

Brotherhood Around the World

I recently met a brother in one of the last places I would think to look—through the end of some vision-testing apparatus (I'm so good with technical terms).

Apparently my ophthalmologist, who also went to Rutgers, was a brother from one of ZBT's rival fraternities, which eventually merged with ZBT nationally. Rivals no more. For me, meeting brothers wherever I go is one of the best things about being a part of ZBT. My time in Washington, D.C. and Israel readily come to mind when it comes to expanding my appreciation of the fraternity's reach outside of Beta Delta.

Besides all the NJ chapters, brothers from Alabama, California, Florida, Illinois, and elsewhere have made my trips to DC and Israel even more fun and meaningful than they would have otherwise been. For example, at my summer internship in DC, I learned that one of my superiors was a Zebe (while his father is chief rabbi of Alpha Epsilon Pi fraternity).

This winter I spent two weeks in Israel meeting diplomats, business-people, soldiers, international students, and regular Israelis, eating falafel, and buying Israeli music (their techno is great, and even their hip hop and rap is improving). We spoke with lawyer Alan Dershowitz, hiked through ancient cities, interacted with Nigerian pilgrims traveling from a kibbutz in Israel to Bethlehem on Christmas, and saw first-hand the security fence being constructed to keep suicide bombers out of Israeli cities and cafes like Cafe Hillel, which was bombed last September killing 7, but which was doing good business again.

Additionally, we met with Israeli minister and former imprisoned Soviet dissident Natan Sharansky, who came to Rutgers when he spoke with student leaders and community members at Hillel and then to an audience of 500 in Scott Hall on College Ave. He mentioned Rutgers in his speech in Israel, in part because of our "Israel Inspires" program (which Beta Delta supported) which brought thousands of people to Busch campus to hear Governor McGreevey, both NJ Senators, a senator from Alabama, and other Members of Congress support Israel and students on campus whose houses have been spray painted with swastikas. Rutgers will also forever be etched in Minister Sharansky's mind because an anti-Israel anarchist student hit him with a cherry pie moments before he was to give his speech. (Being two rows back, I got quite a bit of free pie as well). After cleaning up, Sharansky took the stage and remarked, to the applause of everyone in the room, "NJ makes good cake."

Throughout my trip, I not only made friends from across the U.S. and from Israel, Canada, and Russia (seder in Moscow, anyone?), but also felt I had an additional layer of friendship within my brothers who experienced the amazing trip with me.

I look forward to coming back to Rutgers time and again after I graduate this May. It's nice to know I can find brothers from Rutgers or elsewhere wherever the future takes me.
